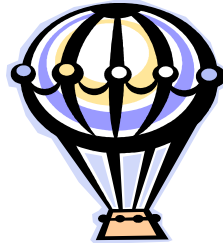
## “HIGH HOPES” PERINATAL PROGRAM

The Middletown Health Department serves as fiscal agent for the OIMRI grant for Butler County. The grant provides funding for pregnant African-American women in Butler County.

The focus of this grant is to help these women obtain the prenatal care they need and to reduce infant mortality and low-birth-weight rates among the African-American community.

Community Care Coordinators work with each mother individually to insure a healthy pregnancy. They also educate them on taking care of themselves during their pregnancy. For more information regarding this program call (513) 425-7850.
